



Born in Paris in 1956, **Frédéric Stehr** is the 6th of a family of seven children. He briefly attended silk screen printing courses at the École professionnelle supérieure des arts graphiques de Paris. He vastly preferred sketching in public gardens for hours, so he also dropped out of the Beaux-Arts and earned a living as a Jack of all trades. He published his first children's book in 1983, after a life-changing meeting at l'école des loisirs. Since then, he has published over 60 children's picture books.


Themes: Growing-up / Relationship Father & Child Age: 1+


I slowly spread out my arms and birds landed on them, thinking they were branches. A couple of them were even dancing on my fingers. It was magical.

Rascal was born in Belgium in 1959. After working in advertising, drawing posters for the theatre and having different jobs, he decided to devote himself to children's books. He has been awarded the Great Prize for children's literature of the French-speaking community of Belgium for 2009–2012.



Because she's hearing-impaired, Kitty has always been captivated by images, signs and the hidden meaning of things. She has two sons, Théodore and Elias. Since 1994, she's devoted herself to children's books. Kitty has won many important prizes in Belgium and France, and in 2010 she received the prestigious Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award (ALMA), the world's largest prize for children's and young people's literature.

But... Boing! Boing!


"What a noise! It's a nightmare, an earthquake!"



Hardcover 80 pages 220 x 298 mm





In the Great Forest, clues lead Killiok and Véronica to a series of encounters: Mr. Hysope the wise, Mystère the cat, the scary Pests, the adorable Moss Babies who are in danger... At the end of their unexpected journey, they discover that Vari Tchésou was, in fact, close to their home!

Themes: Adventure / Imaginary World / Friendship Age: 7+

Anne Brouillard was born in 1967 in Louvain, in Belgium, to a Belgian father and a Swedish mother. She trained to be an illustrator in Bruxelles, at the Saint-Luc school. She is the author and illustrator of more than forty books – most of them for children. They call upon her sensitive study of nature and of the place humans occupy in it. She highlights the significance of everyday life, which she adorns with poetry and light. In 2015, she received the Grand prix triennal de littérature de jeunesse de la Fédération Wallonie-Bruxelles (Belgium).

He mostly enjoys oil and one can discover his illustration work in over a hundred books published in Canada, in the United States and in Europe. He is the recipient of numerous national and international awards
